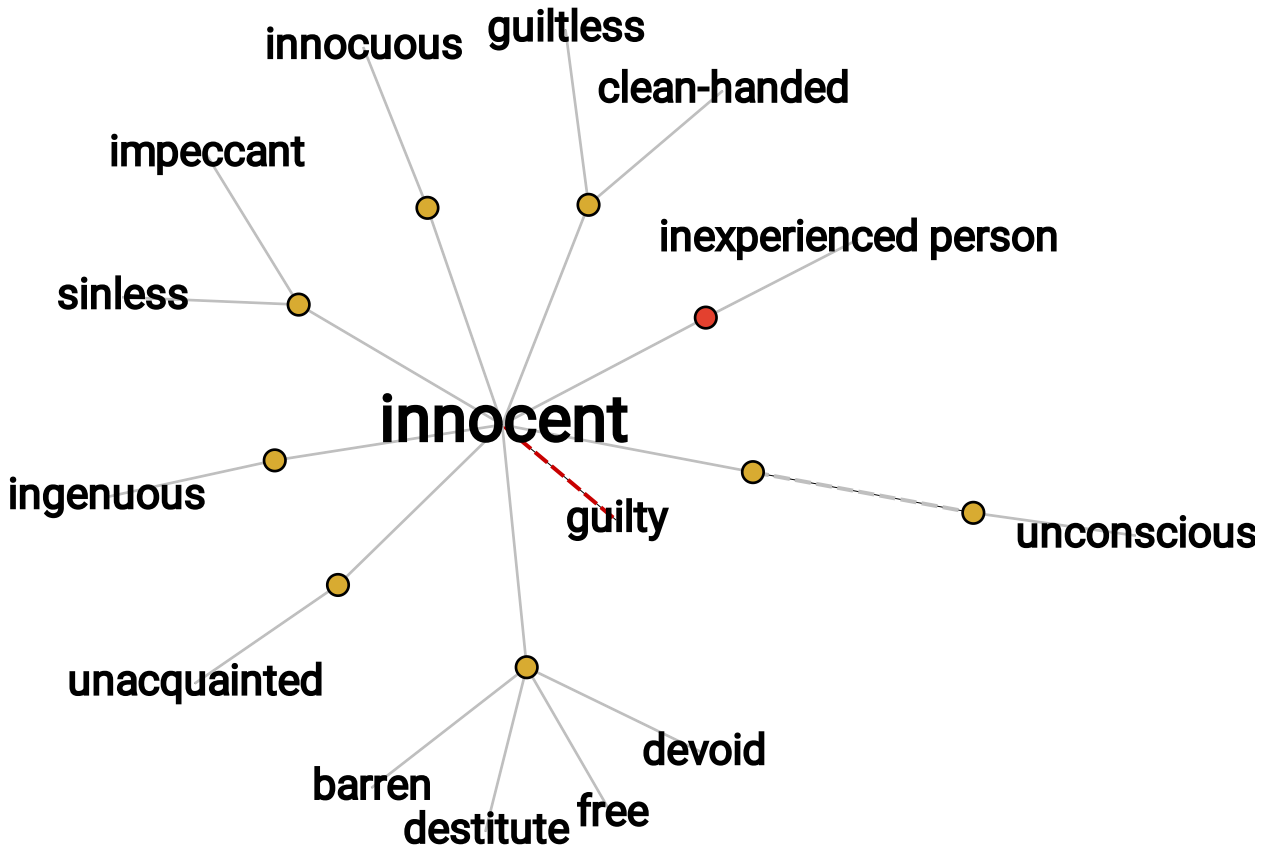


innocent



NOUNS

- **innocent, inexperienced person**
a person who lacks knowledge of evil

ADJECTIVES

- **innocent, clean-handed, guiltless**
free from evil or guilt

"an innocent child"

"the principle that one is innocent until proved guilty"

- **innocent, innocuous**
lacking intent or capacity to injure "an innocent prank"
- **innocent, impeccable, sinless**
free from sin
- **innocent, ingenuous**
lacking in sophistication or worldliness "a child's innocent stare"
"his ingenuous explanation that he would not have burned the church if he had not thought the bishop was in it"
- **innocent, unacquainted**
not knowledgeable about something specified "American tourists wholly innocent of French"
"a person unacquainted with our customs"
- **innocent, barren, destitute, free, devoid**
completely wanting or lacking "writing barren of insight"
"young recruits destitute of experience"
"innocent of literary merit"
"the sentence was devoid of meaning"
- **innocent**
(used of things) lacking sense or awareness "fine innocent weather"
