

In Bengali, "enumerated" can be translated to "সংখ্যাত্মক" (sôngkhyaatmok) or গণিত, which roughly translates to "numerical" or "in the form of a number."

How to pronounce "enumerated" in English?

"Enumerated" is pronounced with the emphasis on the first syllable "en-". The "e" in "en" is pronounced like the "e" in "end", the "u" is pronounced like the "u" in "hut", "m" is pronounced like "m" in "man", "e" in "er" is pronounced like "e" in "her", "r" is pronounced like "r" in "rat" and the last "a" is pronounced like "a" in "bat". The emphasis is on "en" and the stress is on the first syllable.

How to pronounce "enumerated" গণিত/ গণনা করা in Bengali?

"Enumerated" in Bengali is "সংখ্যাত্মক" (sôngkhyaatmok). The "স" (s) is pronounced like the "s" in "sun", the "ং" (ông) is a nasal sound, the "খ" (khyā) is pronounced like the "kh" in "Bach", the "্" (virama) is a diacritical mark used to indicate that the following consonant is not followed by an inherent vowel, the "য" (ya) is pronounced like the "y" in "yes" the "া" (aa) is pronounced like "a" in "father", the "ত" (t) is pronounced like the "t" in "top" and the last "মক" (mok) is pronounced like "mok" in mock.

Another word for Enumerated

Another word for "enumerate" could be "itemize." It means to list things separately, typically with an accompanying explanation or comment.

Another word for "গণনা" (gaṇana) in Bengali is "সংখ্যাবদ্ধকরা" (sôngkhyā-bdhdhakara) which means to "count" or "number".
